Introduction - 1

The current presentation is a concise, especially adapted to guest students, version of the primary one addressed to the Harokopio “local” students enrolled in their first year at 1st cycle of study, in order to redefine the place and the use of the internet, so familiar and so misknown as well, within an academic framework.

The challenge is to present, on the user’s (consumer’s?) – practical - point of view, the internet as a tool for academic studies and research, a tool in a no-linear development and expansion, regularly (re)articulated, and to give some paths to explore it.

The Greek version designed for “fresh.women” first deals with basics and includes many exercises related to the information search and the development of critical thinking about the search results, the bibliographical research as well as the referencing and citing systems of internet resources. – But specific support will be provided if needed.

Guest students are not “fresh.women”, but maybe for the first time they will need to visit Greek and Greece-related web pages. Therefore, the first target is to give them keys to get access through the internet to Greek [Greece-related] content- in a familiar language (English being usually the first-in-use foreign language), and this requires they familiarize with the “Greek web pages”.

Introduction - 2

Priority is given here to a sketch of the “Greek web” for researcher, I mean the internet in Greece and the Greek web portals & pages where researchers, especially in the broad field of Geography, may draw on information and resources, so that the guest students could use it easily for their module projects during their study period at Harokopio University.

I hope that they will acquire new knowledge and develop skills so that in the future they will be able to continue to explore the “Greek web” and include in their projects and personal interests, data, publications, case studies related to Greece.

Obviously, reference to more specific tools will be given by each of the Researchers-Teachers (Faculty Staff members) involved in the English module “Specific Topics of Geography” (ΓΦ4500).

Basic TLD Information - 1

- The **right-most label in a domain name** is referred to as its **"top-level domain" (TLD)**. [www.zzzzzz.zz](#) | [www.zzzzzz.zzz](#)
- **TLDs with two letters** have been established for over 250 countries and external territories and are referred to as "country-code" TLDs or "ccTLDs".
- **TLDs with three or more characters** are referred to as "generic" TLDs, or "gTLDs".

The responsibility for operating each TLD (including maintaining a registry of the domain names within the TLD) is delegated to a particular organization. These organizations are referred to as "registry operators" or "sponsors".

About Top-Level Domains (TLD) & internet identifiers allocation and Domain Name System Changes since October 2016

The allocation of unique Top-Level Domains & internet identifiers as well as the coordination of related Domain Name and other Services were managed at global level by the (US) Internet Assigned Numbers Authority (IANA), <http://www.iana.org>, for ICANN (the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers) and on the basis of a contract with the US Commerce Department National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA).

Due to the ending of the contract and in implementation of the decision of NTIA to hand over (October, 1 2016), changes have occurred.

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN)

- “The Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN) is an internationally organized, non-profit corporation that has responsibility for Internet Protocol (IP) address space allocation, protocol identifier assignment, generic (gTLD) and country code (ccTLD) Top-Level Domain name system management, and root server system management functions. Originally, the Internet Assigned Numbers Authority (IANA) and other entities performed these services under U.S. Government contract. ICANN now performs the IANA function. As a private-public partnership, ICANN is dedicated to preserving the operational stability of the Internet; to promoting competition; to achieving broad representation of global Internet communities; and to developing policy appropriate to its mission through bottom-up, consensus-based processes. The DNS* translates the domain name you type into the corresponding IP address, and connects you to your desired website. The DNS also enables email to function properly, so the email you send will reach the intended recipient.” **From the Glossary**

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN)

- The IANA functions, now performed by ICANN, are key technical services critical to the continued operations of the Internet's underlying address book, the Domain Name System (DNS).
- These functions include:
 - (1) the coordination of the assignment of technical protocol parameters including the management of the address and routing parameter area (ARPA) top-level domain;
 - (2) the administration of certain responsibilities associated with Internet DNS root zone management such as generic (gTLD) and country code (ccTLD) Top-Level Domains;
 - (3) the allocation of Internet numbering resources;
 - and (4) other services.”

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN)

■ The New generic Top-Level Domain Program

“is enabling the largest expansion of the domain name system. Via the introduction of new top-level domains (TLDs), the program aims to enhance innovation, competition and consumer choice.”

“TLDs are the letters found at the end of an Internet address, such as .com, .net, or .org. Any TLD that does not represent a country or a territory is known as a generic TLD, or gTLD. The New gTLD Program has enabled hundreds of new top-level domains in ASCII characters and in different scripts (Internationalized Domain Names) to enter into the Internet's root zone since the first delegations occurred in October 2013.”

■ Internationalized Domain Names

“Internationalized Domain Names (IDNs) are domain names represented by characters other than the traditional ASCII characters (a through z). Such domain names could contain letters or characters from non-Latin scripts (for example, Arabic or Chinese). Many efforts are ongoing in the Internet community to make domain names available in many languages other than those based on the Latin script.” *excerpt from* <https://newgtlds.icann.org/en/about/idns> (accessed on 2018-11-09)

- **Always in 2 letters, on the basis of the 3166-1 ISO code**, the international standard for countries and dependencies
http://www.iso.org/iso/home/standards/country_codes.htm
- Exception to the ISO 3166-1: **.uk** for the United Kingdom of Great-Britain and Northern Ireland, on the basis of a former, older registry, while **.gb** does exist but it is not in use.
- Since December 2005, the cc-TLD **.eu** for European Union is operating. The Second-Level Domain **.europa.eu** has been reserved for EU institution sites.
- Second-Level Domain Names under the cc-TLD are managed at national level.

About Greece - Government and Politics


The Flag



The National Flag of Greece consists of four white and five blue alternating horizontal stripes, with a white cross on the upper left corner. Blue and white are the national colours of Greece, as blue symbolizes the sky and seas and white denotes the purity of the Greek independence struggle. The cross represents the Christian religion. The nine blue-and-white horizontal stripes of the flag stand for the nine syllables of the Greek motto Eleftheria i Thanatos (Greek for Freedom or Death).

The National Anthem


The Hymn to Liberty (or Hymn to Freedom) is a poem written by Dionysios Solomos (1823) and consists of 158 stanzas. It was set to music by Nikolaos Mantzaros, (1865) and it is the longest national anthem in the world by length of text. This anthem has been performed at every closing ceremony of the Olympic Games, to pay tribute to Greece as the birthplace of the ancient Olympics.

The National Emblem



The national emblem of Greece, also known as the coat of arms of Greece, consists of a blue crest with a white cross totally surrounded by two laurel branches. The first Greek national emblem was provided for by the Constitution of Epidaurus of 1 January 1822.

- In the URL address, the word **meleti / ekthesi** (meaning and corresponding to **document / report / study**) may appear, indicating a document usually “downloadable”

About search on the internet with Search engines

- *Don't forget the good practices you have already acquired: moreover, because you are "surfing on uncharted waters", do cross-check!* The challenge for you is to find info about Greek matters in foreign language outside but over all inside the "Greek web pages".
- So, first step: *check where you are*, directly form the TLD or other extension(s), as those characteristics of a blog or personal page: ~user, ~name, blog, wordpress, blog(g)spot...
- secondly, *check who they are*: About (us), who we are..., and maybe you'll get an answer to *where they are*.
- Don't be sure that finding texts in Greek characters / Greek language on the webpage, you are "in Greece": maybe you are "in Cyprus" (.cy), or even elsewhere.

About search on the internet with Search engines

☞ The difference of alphabet could **erroneously** induce that it is easy, maybe easier to know where you/we are on the web.

☞ Would you find info in English about or related to Greece, Athens,... be sure that it is the place you have in mind:

Did you know that i.a. there is a “Greece Central School District” in U.S.A., State of N.Y., Monroe County, where “Greece” is the town’s name, and that in USA again many towns and counties are named Athens?

Search on the internet with Search engines

☞ ***Remain cautious:*** historical example (October 2016)

Supposing that you enter, on Google search, the words: “Foreign Archaeological institutes in Greece”, you’ll get among the results, the link: www.yppo.gr/5/e5420.jsp

- Opening the link, you check you are on the web site of the Hellenic Republic, Ministry of Culture *and Sports*.
- However, on the English version of the Prime Minister’s webpage (19-10-2016), you found the list of the ministries under the title “our government”, where the mentioned ministry is cited as Ministry of Culture *and Tourism*.
- *With no knowledge of Greek language*, you’ll see the difference opening the link corresponding to each ministry. Moreover, you should have noticed that the news on English webpage are “frozen” on October 11, 2015.



Government and Politics


Greece (Ελλάδα, Hellada or Hellas), officially the Hellenic Republic (Ελληνική Δημοκρατία, Elliniki Dimokratia) is a Parliamentary Republic. The President, elected by Parliament every five years, is Head of State. The Prime Minister is Head of Government. The Ministerial Council, consisting of the Prime Minister, Ministers, Deputy Ministers and Ministers without portfolio, is the collective decision-making body that constitutes the Government of Greece.


Legislative power is exercised by Parliament and the President of the Republic. Executive power is exercised by the President of the Republic and the Government. Judicial power is vested in the courts of law, whose decisions are executed in the name of the people.

Although the President of the Republic has limited political power, as most power lies with the government, his duties include formally appointing the Prime Minister, on whose recommendation he also appoints or dismisses other members of government, he represents the State in its relations to other States, proclaims referendums etc.


General elections are normally held every four years unless the Parliament is dissolved earlier. The electorate consists of all Greek citizens who are 18 years of age. Each new Government, after a general election or after the previous government's resignation, has to appear before Parliament and request a vote of confidence.







The center of Athens has been experiencing the most painful of its constant mutations, after the social groups that once formed its urban character abandoned it, and those that wanted to benefit from its unplanned, growth-seeking construction left. During the crisis, Athens, and the country as a whole, were left without the safety net of a developed welfare state. Despite the relatively low level of class and ethnic segregation, the center had been facing significant problems well before the onset of the crisis, following a long period of *laissez-faire* policies in the housing sector, and negligence in urban infrastructure. Starting in the 1970s, the gradual relocation of the upper and middle classes to the suburbs (Maloutas 2013) created amongst those left behind a feeling of entrapment within deteriorating areas. Commercial services also moved to the outskirts, state agencies decentralised, and the least attractive buildings were abandoned, intensifying the degradation that had made the center an affordable option, attracting immigrants in the early 1990s. Although their presence revitalised activities and limited population losses, immigrants became an easy target and were blamed for the deterioration that was actually caused by pre-existing conditions.

An overview of the project's proposals reveals to policy-makers alternative ways that can strengthen social cohesion and economic development. This, of course, implies setting clear regulations regarding the rights and obligations of all involved, encouraging bonding solidarity ideals instead of disciplining, meaningful participation at various governance levels, inventive de-commodification where the market cannot or does not perform to yield positive effects, etc. It is imperative to achieve an organisation at the lowest possible spatial level: the proposed solutions will not be viable unless actively adopted by the locals and monitored through local organisational resources.






